The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania through the Ministry of Minerals (MoM) has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the **Tanzania Extractive Industries Accountability and Governance Enhancement Project** and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services.

The consulting services ("the Services") intent is to carry out a scoping study to inform the MSG's decisions on the scope of the 2019/20 TEITI report and thereafter produce the 2019/20 report in accordance with the EITI Standard, 2019, terms of references, TEITA Act, 2015 and its regulations of 2019.

The assignment is expected to start in August, 2021. The detailed Terms of Reference (TOR) for the assignment will be available at the Ministry of Minerals Website: www.madini.go.tz and TEITI website: www.teiti.go.tz.

The Ministry of Minerals, on behalf of TEITI Committee now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The short listing criteria are: (i) Expertise and experience in the oil, gas and mining sectors; (ii) Experience in scoping and EITI reconciliation assignments preferably in Tanzania context; (iii) A track record in similar work and previous experience relevant to the assignment; (iv) Experience in accounting, auditing, economic and financial analysis. Key Experts will not be evaluated at the short listing stage.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" July 2016, revised in November 2017 and August 2018 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Consultant's Qualification Selection (CQS) method set out in the Procurement Regulations.
